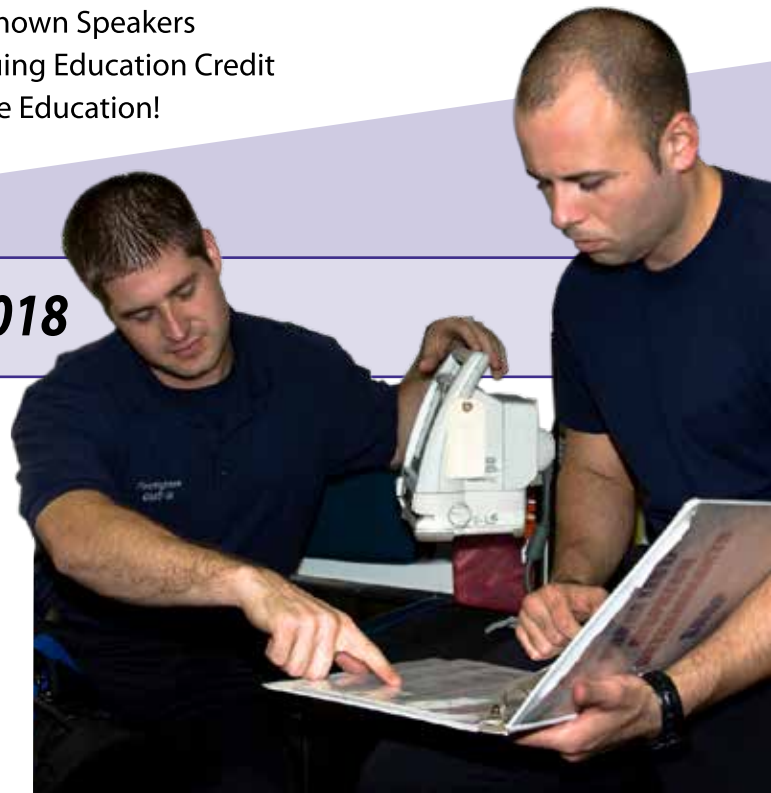

Prehospital utilization of capnography has now become the standard of care, for both intubated and spontaneously breathing patients. In addition, it provides excellent monitoring to evaluate rapid changes in perfusion, therapy and condition for the acutely ill patient. This session will review the basics of capnography, using case scenarios to demonstrate its clinical application and availability for all age groups!

We will discuss lightning facts, myths, and injury patterns common to lightning strikes. Special emphasis will be placed on initial triage and treatment options in this informative and entertaining multimedia session.

You don't control Events. You don't control Outcomes. You earn Outcomes based on the discipline of your Response: $E + R = O$ (Event + Response = Outcome). Behavior, not talent, technology, or tactics, is the driving force of strategic success. Elite results require discipline-driven behavior. Leaders who teach discipline-driven response, create a culture that performs at elite levels. These principles are derived from, and described in detail in "Above the Line Leadership" by Urban Meyer and Tim Kight.

Trauma in the Water (Trauma – 1 CE)**Matthew Mankins, NRP**

The effects of surface impacts on the human body and mechanisms of injuries that occur above and below the water line will be discussed. We will use an assessment-based approach to understand the effects water has on the trauma patient, both at the time of injury and as they remain in the water.
